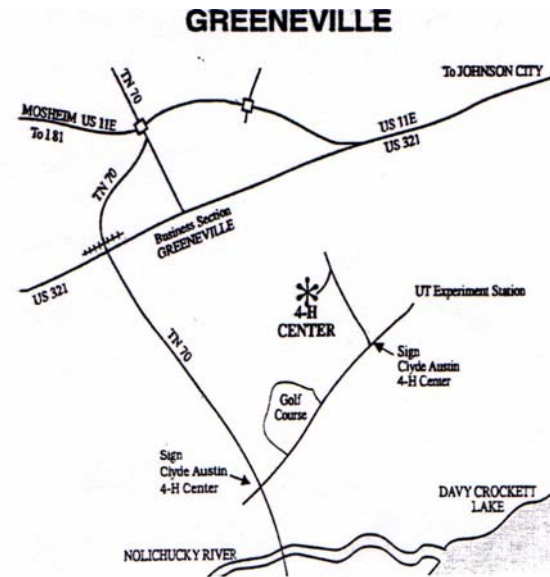

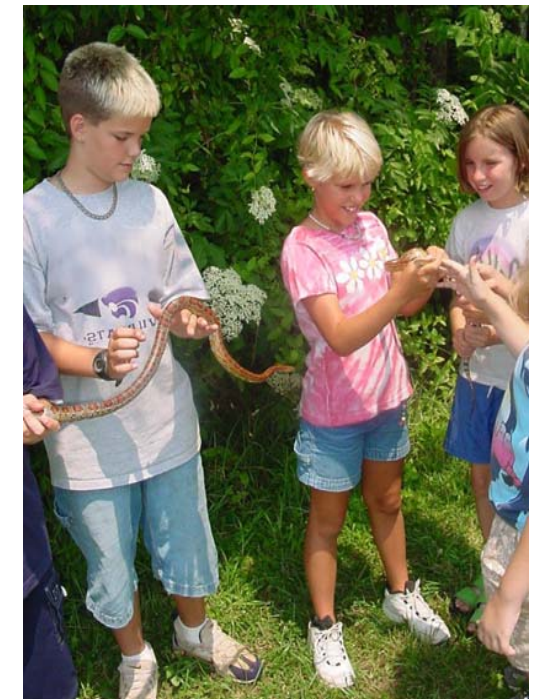

This is the entrance to the 4-H Center and is also marked by a University of Tennessee sign.
